On November 29, 2011 I gave a 10-question multiple-choice quiz of programming languages concepts in my COP 4555 class. There were 15 students present, out of 25 enrolled in the class. (Attendance has been a problem throughout the semester.) The complete results are shown in the following table, which has a row giving the results for each student (labeled 'A' through 'O') and a column giving the results for each question, using '1' for 'correct' and '0' for 'incorrect'.
